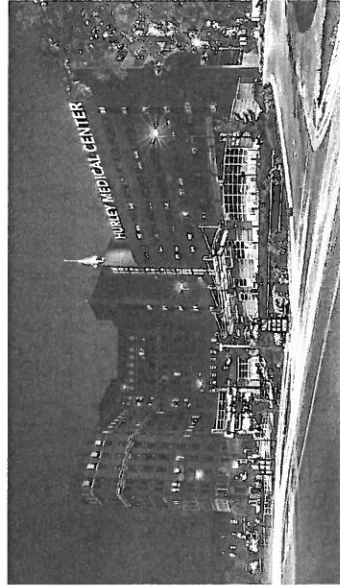

Hurley Medical Center was founded in 1908 to provide a hospital for all citizens, regardless of their ability to pay. Today, this 443-bed teaching hospital provides the highest level of care available in the region through its Level I Trauma Center, Level II Pediatric Trauma Center and Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Other specialty care centers include the Burn Center, Kidney Transplantation Center, Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, Pediatric Emergency Room and Maternal/Fetal Care Center. Hurley annually has more than 20,000 inpatients and 95,000 visits in its Emergency Department.

You can donate your time and talents in one of the following programs:

OPPORTUNITIES FOR INDIVIDUALS

ADULT VOLUNTEER: Must be 18 years of age. As an Adult Volunteer, you will be a highly visible member of the Hurley Family in one of over 20 service areas. **COMMITMENT:** Six (6) months of 4 hour shifts on the same day each week.

HIGH SCHOOL: Hurley's High School Volunteer program is the only one in Genesee County. Must be at least 15 years of age, have at least a 2.8 GPA and good attendance in school. This program is co-sponsored by Genesee Medical Alliance. **COMMITMENT:** Three (3) months, 4 hour shifts on the same day each week.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR GROUPS

ADOPT A FLOOR: Group members must be 18 years of age and we ask that the group make a commitment of covering the same 4 hour time slot each week. **NOTE:** Orientation will be provided prior to beginning and group members can rotate who volunteers each week.

SPONSOR A COMFORT CART: Comfort Carts have been placed throughout the hospital and contain activities and comfort items for patients who are suffering long term illnesses and any other patient who would benefit from these activities. The group can sponsor a cart by maintaining the cart by donations of any of the following items: CD's (cultural, gospel, soul, jazz, easy listening), lip balm, lotion, nail polish, playing cards, jigsaw puzzles, puzzle books, thank you cards, notepads, and new lap blankets/afghans/quilts.

Volunteer Areas for Adults

Lobby Shop/Goodie Cart: The biggest fundraiser for the volunteers. Profits from the Lobby Shop support Hurley endeavors. Volunteers assist customers, stock shelves, etc. Hurley Lobby Shop was voted one of the best gift shops in Genesee County by the Chamber of Commerce.

Surgical Lounge: Volunteers are responsible for checking in the surgical patients loved ones, acts as a liaison between them and the surgeon while also providing comfort to those that are waiting.

Compassionate Care: Volunteers help to provide comfort to patients who can benefit from extra emotional support and/or other activities.

Guest Relations: Volunteers are assigned to a variety of areas including GI Lab, Cath Lab, Information Desk, Outpatient Clinic and provide directions, wheelchair escorts and other assistance.

NICU: Volunteers help screen visitors, assemble discharge packets and may be asked to help console babies.

Child Life: By participating in activities in the playroom and at the bedside, Child Life volunteers help distract our youngest patient's from their situation and helping to make their hospital stay as pleasant as possible. They also help to oversee the playroom.

Emergency Waiting Room: Volunteers work alongside the Admitting staff and act as a patient/family liaison. Other duties include greeting visitors, providing escorts, assistance with wheelchairs and helping with phone calls.

On Call Chaplains: Ordained ministers and specially trained lay-people assist in meeting our patient's spiritual needs.

Physical Therapy & Radiology: Placement is normally available in these areas for college age volunteers.

Research: Volunteers assist with data collection and data entry on a limited basis.
